4. Cultural Exchange Programme with Warraphat School

During the June 2024 holidays, 20 of our Primary 5 pupils visited Warraphat School in Hat Yai, Thailand, as part of the school's cultural exchange programme. Our pupils had the opportunities to experience Thai culture and traditions as well as be engaged in hands-on activities such as learning about the different Thai music, dances and costumes, playing Thai traditional games, concocting a traditional dessert and trying their hands at making local handicrafts. In addition, our pupils worked hand-in-hand with the Thai pupils from Warraphat School to co-construct a rubberband powered car using recycled materials.

Teachers and pupils from the Warraphat School visited our school on 15 July 2024 to commemorate Racial Harmony Day together with us and to learn more about our local culture through the cultural activities which we had curated specially for them such as making of Wayang Kulit puppets, painting of Chinese Opera masks and making of mini Indian Dumroos (drums).

It was an enriching learning experience for our Primary 5 pupils who formed new friendships with the pupils from Warraphat School and developed multi-cultural skills.

In addition, our pupils also excelled at the Singapore Youth Festival (SYF) 2024 Arts Presentation where they attained the Certificate of Distinction for International Dance and Certificate of Accomplishment for Band (Brass Ensemble).

Learning is a continuous journey, and we remain committed to supporting our pupils' growth and development as 'Confident Persons', 'Joyful Learners' and 'Caring Citizens'.

6. Attendance and Punctuality

Regular pupil attendance will have a positive impact on his/her learning. A child who is absent frequently will miss out on the learning experiences in school. It will also affect the bonds he/she forms with their classmates. Thus, we would expect our pupils to be in school during school term unless he/she has taken ill or needs to be excused from school for important private reasons. Please ask your child/ward to submit the medical certificate or any other valid documents to the form teacher when he/she returns to school after his/her day of absence. You may wish to refer to our Student Handbook (page 7) for more details.

Punctuality is a good habit that we would like to cultivate in our pupils. Hence, all pupils are expected to be in school by 7.30 a.m. Pupils who come to school late (reporting after 7.30 a.m.) will be booked for late-coming and issued with a late-coming slip for every incidence of late-coming. A notification letter will be issued to parents for pupils who are late for school for 5 times within 5 weeks. We seek your help in ensuring that your child/ward comes to school punctually. Please note that recalcitrant late-coming will affect the overall conduct grade of your child/ward.

7. School Attire

With Singapore continuing to experience warm weather, the pupils can continue to come to school in their PE attire (except on the days of school-based and national examinations) until further notice. P4 to P6 female pupils should wear the PE shirt and skorts to school and change into the PE shorts only during PE lessons. Teachers will continue to give pupils regular hydration breaks and keep a lookout for pupils who show discomfort or are unwell.
